and struggle."



Delegates then enjoyed a campus tour, including a visit to LIBA, followed by a cultural evening featuring performances by students from various Jesuit institutions under the coordination of Mr. Porres.

Day two began with Mass in the college chapel, followed by elections for the next General Council. Mr. Thomas (Chennai) was elected President; Dr. Anthony Stephen (Madurai), Secretary; Mr. Naveen Mascarenhas (SACAA/Karnataka), Treasurer; Advocate Jayaraj (Kerala), Vice President; and Mr. Desu Ramesh (Andhra), Joint Secretary. Each province selected five GC members, including Dr. Richard Gonsalves and Mr. Naveen from SACAA, and Prof. Edmund Frank, Vice President of National JAAI, joined as an ex-officio member. A talk on the history of Jesuit education in India followed.
